2011 Academic Schedule of the Graduate School of Information Science and Technology

Although some of the graduate schools and undergraduate faculties of the University of Tokyo may change their academic schedules due to the 2011 Tohoku-Pacific Ocean Earthquake, the Graduate School of Information Science and Technology adopts its original schedule, starting its summer semester in April, taking all precautions and preparations for security and power saving.

The 2011 academic schedule is planned as follows, with the exception that in the first academic week of April (Monday April 4th ~ Friday April 8th) of the summer semester, all the lecture classes will be cancelled, in order to complete the above precautions and preparations. Some classes may start even later due to considerations about participants from other departments and schools. All the English classes will start on/after May 6th (Fri.). The starting dates of the classes will be posted on the IST web page (http://www.i.u-tokyo.ac.jp/index_e.shtml) and the notice boards, so be sure to check them regularly. Those students who have difficulties in attending the classes due to the aftereffect of the earthquake may request for special handling to the faculty member in charge of each class.

The students are also requested to participate in activities towards establishing safe research environment in their laboratories starting from April under the supervision of each advisor.
